Dear GGC friends,

Laying the foundation

The last few months have seen me laying the foundation of GGC. I have focussed on:

- Learning by talking with agency leaders, reading and immersing myself in the missions world
- **Speaking** about GGC at missions events and to agency leaders and church pastors
- **Earning trust** by meeting with agency leaders for them to get to know me and be able to recommend me to churches
- Resourcing myself by discovering and assessing the myriads of websites, articles, books and videos that could be useful to churches
- **Structuring** GGC as an organisation so that it is relevant, attractive, legal and sustainable



It's been a fascinating and stretching experience for me personally, but hopefully by God's grace it's one that results in a ministry that serves God's church and ultimately sees disciples being made of people from all tribes and nations. A good foundation for GGC will enable it in the future to become more than just my own ministry, but a network of like-minded pastors serving churches.

The main promotion of GGC at this stage will occur as agency leaders are confident to recommend me to help them with their missions involvement.

Please pray that GGC's foundation be laid well in order that it be an ongoing useful instrument in God's hands.

To help me lay the foundation and build on it, four very able and experienced people have joined me on the GGC team. They share the GGC vision and will give me advice, direction and wisdom. We will meet for the first time as a group in the next few weeks. As individuals they have already been helpful to me in thinking about GGC. They are Bruce Dipple, Tim Roediger, John Menzies and Mark Fairhurst. All bring different skills and backgrounds to the task.

Please pray that the Board's first meeting be encouraging and effective in setting a good foundation for GGC, and that we all get on well with each other!

I've been asked to conduct seminars at two mission conferences coming up in July and September. They are

the Missions Interlink National Conference and the Sydney Missionary and Bible College's Centenary Conference.

It is a privilege to be involved.

I have also been asked to conduct a weeklong missions consultation with a church on the north coast sometime in the near future.
